

Banyan specializes in the youth justice sector by providing residential, court support, and reintegration services to youth aged 12-17 who are in conflict with the law. The organization operates two secure custody/detention centres (Arrell Youth Centre and Peninsula Youth Centre) and one open-custody residential program (George R. Force Group Home). Banyan strives to prevent youth crime, reduce recidivism, and contribute to community safety by treating youth with respect and dignity in our specialized programs.


Youth learn employment related skills such as resume writing, interviewing, and job retention.

Banyan provides children's support through SNAP® for Boys and SNAP® for Girls. SNAP® is a family focused early intervention program for children aged 6–11 experiencing behavioural difficulties at home, in school, or in the community. Professional and qualified staff teach children and their families how to stop, calm down, and generate positive solutions at the "snap" of their fingers.

Funded, in part, by the HNHB LHIN and the City of Hamilton, Banyan's Grocer-Ease program is designed to assist older persons and adults with disabilities to stay in their homes independently through the provision of a regular grocery shopping service. Professional and committed shoppers obtain grocery lists, shop at local stores, deliver groceries, and assist in putting groceries away if help is required. Based on our 2016-2017 client satisfaction survey, 100% of clients agreed that Grocer-Ease helped them remain in their home.

Working "Better. Together." To Reduce Social Isolation

For many isolated individuals in Hamilton, Grocer-Ease is more than just a shopping service and represents a vital connection to the community. Our experienced staff understand that, in order to ensure vulnerable populations do not fall through the cracks of the social safety net, community support services must work "Better.Together." Grocer-Ease works closely with many agencies, including AbleLiving, St. Joseph's Home Care, Wesley Urban Ministries, Catholic Family Services, and the Hamilton Seniors Isolation Impact Plan's (HSIIP) Community Connectors. HSIIP is a collaborative initiative to reduce isolation among seniors in Hamilton. It is funded in part by the Government of Canada's New Horizons for Seniors Program and will be carried out between May 2016 and April 2019. There are currently almost 12,000 isolated seniors in the Greater

Hamilton region and one of the goals of the HSIIP is to link these individuals with services in the community like Grocer-Ease. One HSIIP client, Mrs. A, was living with no family or friends, a physical disability, and little food. Mrs. A was connected to the Grocer-Ease program, which provides her with home-delivery of groceries and personal interaction.

It is also vital that issues impacting seniors' ability to live independently at home are addressed at a system-wide level. Grocer-Ease is represented on several cross-sectoral coalitions including the Seniors Inclusion Coalition, Council Against Abuse of Older Adults and the Hamilton Falls Prevention Coalition. Banyan is committed to ensuring Hamilton's most at-risk populations continue to receive all the services they require.

Senior Services

The Grocer-Ease client base has increased by 25% since last year!

Upcoming Initiatives

In February 2017, Banyan received a grant from the New Horizons for Seniors Program to complete our "Balance is Everything—Helpful Hints & Recipes for Seniors" cookbook project. This initiative will promote social participation by providing an opportunity for seniors living in their own homes to share favourite recipes and related personal memories. The cookbook will include helpful hints on how to cook economic, healthy, and simple meals. A Public Health Dietitian will also provide an alternative list of ingredients (e.g. low-sodium) for healthier versions of each recipe. We look forward to the kick-off of this initiative!








Expenses By Program
