Banyan's CEO, Kim Ciavarella remarked, "In September 2023 Banyan embarked on a journey to engage our community and Ministry leaders to help find solutions and shape the future of how to best meet the needs of those we serve in the Hamilton area. As a result of those discussions, we are pleased our new program helps to address the transitional support needs of 12-17 year olds. This program fosters hope and resiliency to those who face significant barriers and are otherwise unable to be supported in other settings.
